- To build and maintain community infrastructure, such as schools, hospitals, footpaths, and community centers.



Leveraging its extensive network of 160 Masajid and Madaris, the MMF is organizing free medical camps across the twin cities (Islamabad and Rawalpindi), Gilgit Baltistan, and every district of Azad Kashmir. This initiative strategically involves the Imams

and Islamic teachers associated with these institutions in raising health awareness within their local congregations and communities.

This multi-faceted project where MMF did an integrated healthcare and awareness campaign that utilizing its existing social and religious infrastructure to deliver essential medical health education rural services and to populations. The key components of this project likely include:

These respected figures within the community are being engaged to raise awareness about important health issues, hygiene practices, disease prevention, and the availability of the free medical camps. Their influence and trusted position within the community can significantly improve health literacy and encourage people to utilize the medical services offered.

- Geographical Reach: The project's extensive geographical coverage, encompassing the twin cities, the remote region of Gilgit Baltistan, and all districts of Azad Kashmir, demonstrates a commitment to reaching a wide spectrum of rural communities often marginalized in terms of healthcare access.
- Community Engagement: By anchoring the awareness campaigns and medical camps within the local Masajid and Madaris, the project fosters strong community engagement and ownership. This approach

- can help build trust and ensure the sustainability of health-seeking behaviors.

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frequent and intense extreme weather events such as:


